Saving money on your Council Tax

If you, or someone you live with, has a diagnosis of dementia

People who are considered 'severely mentally impaired' are not counted when working out Council Tax.

Severe mental impairment means a permanent condition which severely affects intellectual or social functioning. This can include conditions like Parkinson's, dementia, and learning disabilities.

You will need a certificate from a registered medical practitioner saying that you are severely mentally impaired and show that you are entitled to certain benefits

If you live with other people



You can get a discount if you are older than 18 and have a severe mental impairment.

Each person in the property with a severe mental impairment must apply separately.

If you live by yourself

If you live alone and have a severe mental impairment, you do not have to pay Council Tax and should apply for an exemption
